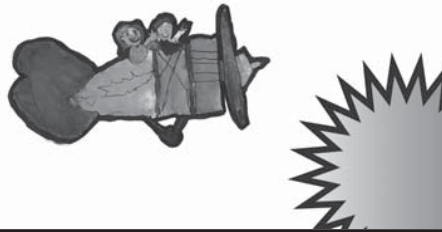

CONTEST RULES

FORMAT: Artwork must be completed on ONLY 11" x 17" paper – **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Use of copyrighted material is not permitted. Three-dimensional work will not be accepted. Artwork **MUST NOT** be framed, mounted or outlined with any type of border. No collaborations permitted; only one student may work on a submitted art work. No digital art will be accepted.

MEDIA: **PERMITTED:** Art work may be crayon, watercolor, acrylic or oil paint, color pencil, indelible marker pen, felt-tip pen, soft ballpoint pen or any similar indelible medium. **NOT PERMITTED:** Digital art, pencil, charcoal, oil crayon, chalk, or collage work involving the use of photocopies ARE NOT eligible for this contest.

ARTIST INFORMATION: Full name, address, age, birth date, name of school with address and grade must be clearly printed on the attached form which, when completed, should then be securely affixed to the back of the artwork. This information is kept secure and not available to the public. **PLEASE NOTE:** Artwork submitted with incomplete entry forms will not be judged.

The parent, guardian or teacher must certify works sent to this contest are the student's original work by signing the attached entry form in the space provided.

TEACHERS PLEASE NOTE: An additional separate list that includes school name and phone number, teacher's name, student names, ages, and grades must accompany each classroom's submittal.

AGES: JWA contest entries will be judged at each grade level from Kindergarten through Grade 12, in two categories. They are:
Category I: Grades K – 6 **Category II: Grades 7 – 12**

IMPORTANT NOTE: Winning artworks selected for exhibition will become the property of John Wayne Airport and may be used for a variety of purposes and may not be returned. Selected artworks may be retained for permanent display after the close of the exhibition; others will be returned, if possible. Entries that best depict this year's theme will be selected by the judges for exhibition. The entries not selected for exhibition will be returned in approximately 60 to 90 days.
